Blanquerna Human Rights 2017- 2018 Course at the United Nations in Geneva

From August 6-10, 2018 UN Human Rights treaty and charter bodies will meet in session at the (United Nations Offices in Geneva (UNOG). The Committee on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination (CERD) will review the State reports submitted by Bosnia & Herzegovina, China, China-Hong Kong, China - Macau, Cuba, Japan, Latvia, Mauritius and Mozambique. In the UN Human Rights Council's Advisory Committee, independent experts will draft reports on thematic studies, such as implementation of international human rights instruments in cities.

The Blanquerna FCRI United Nations Human Rights Course aims at giving students the opportunity to become effective observers of and participants in the session meetings of these human rights mechanisms and witness cooperation projects related to State's reviews and thematic studies.

Meetings with staff of the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights, Permanent Mission to UNOG, International Organizations, NGO, think tanks and substate actors will be scheduled. Visits are currently being planned and some (Permanent Mission of Colombia to the UN, UNHCR staff and UNICEF) have already been confirmed.

Course Fee:

- With 10 students enrolled, the fee is 1100 Euro p.p.
- With 15 students enrolled, the fee is 800 Euros p.p.

The fee **DOES** include: Professors' classes, Accreditation and Entry to United Nations, Course certificate, 1 ECTS optional credit at FCRI (upon submission of a final mission report).

The fee **DOES NOT** include: student travel to/from Geneva, food, student insurance, student transport, student housing (Admitted students will be sent a list with affordable housing possibilities).
